### WHAT IS A PGWP?

#### A PGWP IS...

- An open work permit
- Allows you to gain Canadian work experience after graduation (e.g., full-time, part-time, selfemployment)
- Possible occupational restrictions (e.g. health care, primary/secondary school, childcare)
- Can only be issued once per lifetime





### WHO IS ELIGIBLE FOR A PGWP?

#### Some PGWP Criteria:

- ☐ Complete an eligible program in Canada that's at least 8-month in length
- ☐ Continuous full-time enrollment in your regular academic sessions except for authorized Leave of Absence or final term
- ☐ If distance learning is allowed, it must not exceed 50% of your program

If applying from inside Canada, please ensure you have a valid study permit at the time you apply.

### DCS DEFINITIONS & PGWP ELIGIBILITY

#### **Full-time Definitions at DCS**

• 3 courses per term, of at least 36 hours per course

#### Regular Academic Sessions

- Fall session (September to December)
- Winter session (January April)
- Summer session (May to August) (if first study term)

#### **Summer Scheduled Breaks**

(This does not apply if the summer session is your first or last study term.)



### POST-GRADUATION WORK PERMIT VALIDITY

A PGWP can be granted for a minimum of 8 months to a maximum of 3 years.

- 8 months to <2 years = the length of the program completed
- 2 years or longer = 3 years

# FACILITATION MEASURES: PART-TIME STATUS

- Students in Canada or outside of Canada may have been required to put their studies on hold or become part-time students due to course cancellations that were the result of public health measures at DLIs.
  - For the winter, spring and summer semesters of 2020 only (that is, between January 1, 2020, and August 31, 2020), if a student's status changed from full-time to part-time because of changes in course delivery at a DLI, their eligibility for a PGWP will not be impacted.



# FULL FACILITATION MEASURES: DISTANCE LEARNING

- All students who were enrolled in PGWP-eligible programs in March 2020, or who started a program of study between March 2020 and August 31, 2022, are not required to complete 50% of their program (or programs) of study in Canada.
  - Up to 100% of their program can be completed online from outside Canada.
- For the above group of students, up until August 31, 2024, time spent studying outside of Canada can be counted toward the overall length of the PGWP.



# REDUCED FACILITATION MEASURES: DISTANCE LEARNING

All students who started or will start a program of study between September 1, 2022, and August 31, 2024, are required to complete at least 50% of their program (or programs) of study in Canada.

 For the above group of students, up until August 31, 2024, time spent studying outside of Canada will be counted toward the overall length of the PGWP only if it constitutes less than 50% of the program.

\*Any time a student spent studying outside of Canada **after** August 31, 2024, and any time spent studying outside Canada before applying for a study permit, will be deducted from the length of the PGWP, regardless of when the student started or will start their program of study.\*





### HOW TO APPLY FOR A PGWP

- Apply online
- In Canada: apply within 90
  days after you receive your final grade
  AND have a valid study permit at the
  time of application
- Outside Canada, you can apply within 180 days after you receive your final grade.

- Program completion letter
- Official transcript or administrative transcript from <u>DCS</u>
   My Account
- Valid passport
- ☐ Digital photo
- ☐ Credit or debit card to pay your fees online
- ☐ Medical exam (if applicable)
- ☐ Biometrics (if applicable)





### **PGWP APPLICATION TIPS**

- Apply for graduation in your final term
- Only request for a <u>program completion letter</u> and final transcript when your final grades are available on your DCS My Account.
- Only submit your PGWP application when you receive UVic documents (a program completion letter AND final transcript).
- Consult <u>Instruction Guide [IMM 5580]</u> as needed.
- Read the questions carefully and answer them honestly.




#### PGWP APPLICATION TIPS

- Online applications are saved in your account for up to 60 days only.
- Keep paper or electronic copies of your application form and supporting documents.
- Take screenshots at different stages.
- Monitor your application status online.
- Consult us before you submit the application if you have questions.
- Use IRCC Web Form to raise questions if needed.

# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQS)

- How early can I submit a PGWP application?
- How long does it take to process my application?
  - Estimated processing times (subject to change)
- Can I work after my final exam and before my final grade is posted on the DCS My Account administrative transcript? (IRCC – working while studying / temporary policy change)
- Can I work while my PGWP application is being processed?
  - Check Working while we process your application on the IRCC website



# FAQS CONTINUED...

- Can I <u>travel outside of Canada</u> while I have a PGWP application being processed in Canada?
- Do I need to have a job in order to keep the PGWP valid?
- Can I renew a PGWP?
- How can I prove to a potential employer that I am eligible to work while I await processing of my application? (IRCC)
- Can I apply to extend my family members' status while I apply for a PGWP
  - Spousal Open Work Permit eligibility
  - Changes to open work permit eligibility for family members of foreign workers





# FAQS CONTINUED...

- How long does it take to receive a program completion letter?
- How can I update my mailing address after submitting my PGWP application?
  - Use IRCC Web Form
- Can I apply for PGWP while on maintained status?
- Can I apply for PGWP from outside of Canada?
- Is full-time status required for summer terms?
- Can I apply on my own?





## FAQS CONTINUED...

- What if my study permit expires after applying for PGWP and before approval?
- If I don't meet the PGWP eligibility requirements, what can I do?
- Can I study my 2 year diploma program faster than 2 years and still be eligible for a PGWP valid for up to 3 years?
  - IRCC Accelerated studies
- Will receiving Advanced Standing for courses affect the PGWP validity?
  - IRCC Transfers between educational institutions
